

# Consultation on revised waste exemptions from environmental permitting

**Defra, the Welsh Assembly Government and the Environment Agency have developed proposals for revised exemptions from environmental permitting for waste operations.**

We are proposing changing the waste exemption system across England and Wales to make sure that the level of regulation of waste operations matches the risk they pose to the environment.

## The main proposals are:

- The current exemptions will be replaced with updated exemptions under the headings of: use, treatment, disposal and storage at the place of production
- Some higher risk activities will move to be regulated through Standard Permits
- Simple exemptions will no longer be registered for life, you'll need to re-register every three years
- A registration charge will be put in place to cover the Environment Agency's costs of regulating the exemptions
- The majority of Environment Agency Low Risk Positions will benefit from one of the proposed updated exemptions.

## Who will this consultation affect?

Anyone currently operating under an exemption or an Environment Agency low risk waste position, or anyone transferring waste to one of these sites.

DEFRA, the Welsh Assembly Government and the Environment Agency are holding a number of workshops to discuss the proposals in detail. You, or your industry representative, are invited to attend these, and more information on the workshops can be found at the website above.
