At the end of this form you are asked to indicate the length of time taken to complete it. We use this to work out how successful we are in minimising the amount of paperwork we ask you to do.

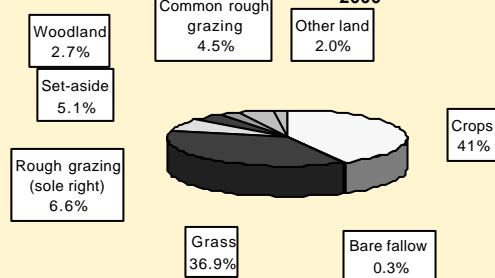
